

Prevent Agenda Policy

Introduction

This policy sets out to expectations and standards in relation to the Prevent Duty and the obligations on British Marine in this context.

Scope

This policy applies to all key stakeholders engaged with the End-point Assessment activities on behalf of British Marine and any person who can influence the outcomes of End-point Assessment. This includes Employers, Contractors, Partner Organisations, and British Marine employees and volunteers.

For the avoidance of doubt, this policy applies whether work is being undertaken directly for British Marine or via one of its subsidiaries.

Definitions

Section 26 of the Counter-Terrorism and Security Act 2015 (the Act) places a duty on certain bodies ("specified authorities" listed in Schedule 6 to the Act), in the exercise of their functions, to have "due regard to the need to prevent people from being drawn into terrorism".

British Marine has a responsibility to promote the welfare of all children and young people and to keep them safe. We are committed to perform in a way that protects them and acts in the spirit of the Prevent Agenda.

PRINCIPLES

- It is recognised that radicalisation can occur to an individual from any section of society and is not particular to any racial, ethnic or social group. It is further recognised that in many instances the process of radicalisation is essentially one of grooming by others.
- Should any British Marine End-point Assessment Assessor or representative have concerns or suspicions of radicalisation from their interactions with any apprentice, they will be required to report them to the safeguarding lead in a timely manner who will then follow the appropriate reporting process.
- All British Marine End-point Assessment Assessors will be expected to complete Prevent Training, British Marine require End-point Assessment Assessors undertake the government training and download the certificate once completed - this will then be kept on the assessors record: <https://www.elearning.prevent.homeoffice.gov.uk/>
- All British Marine End-point Assessment Assessors will be expected to complete safeguarding training, and in addition to reading and signing to confirm their understanding of this prevent duty policy, will also be required to read and sign to confirm their understanding of British Marine's safeguarding policy.

If a child/young person or vulnerable adult discloses to you that they or another child have been radicalised, or if you suspect from what you observe that they are being abused, you MUST REPORT THIS.

Monitoring the Policy

This policy will be reviewed annually to ensure that its provisions continue to meet the legal obligations of British Marine and reflect best practice.
